Howard Dill is still undisputedly and singularly the most important person in the world of Giant Pumpkin Growing. He is very proud of the 1689 Jutras, and also offers kudos to Don Young for the 1662, and Dan McKie


for the 1631. For 25 years the heritage of those original "Dills Atlantic Seeds" have always been in our minds. Howards mission to continue to provide top quality seeds, still is one of the primary reason the sport continues to flourish. He brings countless new growers into the sport every year, with his worldwide distribution of about 2000 lbs of seeds per year. How did this man, who was born in Windsor, Hants County, Nova Scotia about 72 years ago, isolate this strain of seeds and create Howard Dill Enterprises. Well in the Dill family it really started in the 1920's,

when an amateur pumpkin fancier named William Dill of Windsor Nova Scotia started crossing several varieties of Squash and Pumpkin seeds (including Goderich Giants, Genuine Mammoth and Mammoth Tours), under garden conditions. The selected seeds were saved each year for the next years planting by William until the 1950s. Then during the 50's and 60's his son, a young Howard Dill, developed an interest in large pumpkins, and developed a self managed selection process using the family seed stock. Hand pollination and selection techniques were practiced and recorded until 1973, when it was apparent to Howard that two strains were isolated; one producing mature fruit which was tall and wide and the other, long and not as tall.



Howard knew he had something, and he had to protect the "Dills Atlantic Giant" so in 1986, with the help of Ray Waterman from the WPC, a New York Corporation was set up for Howard so he could file for USDA Plant Variety Protection (PVP) in Canada. This was the botanical worlds version of a patent. And for eighteen years it reigned supreme. Howards namesake was now attached to the seed, and big companies could not muscle in. He let us growers selectively cross pollinate, trade or sell the seeds, We had free reign to do whatever we wanted, and in doing so Dill Enterprises Ltd grew and the namesake "Dill's Atlantic Giant" grew

with it, to achieve the stratospheric weights we see today.

In addition to his contribution to the popularization of Pumpkin growing, Mr. Dill's capacity to teach, instruct and inform thousands of visitors to his farm each year on agricultural matters is an invaluable asset that will be carried with the visitors for years to come. School buses by the hundreds visit his farm yearly for a hands on learning experience which could never be duplicated in the classroom.

It is because of the Atlantic Giant seeds developed by Howard, that



Pumpkin Festivals and pumpkin weight competitions take place in countless communities an many countries, where entrants compete for World titles and substantial monetary prizes. In his book The Pumpkin

King, Al Kingsbury has stated "The Atlantic Giant is being grown each year by an estimated 10,000 serious competitors and perhaps millions of home gardeners". And despite having no formal education in genetics, Howard, for his contributions to heightening the awareness of agricultural practices has been presented as an Honorary Associate of the Nova Scotia Agricultural College

As once stated by N. Rigoloso. "We are fortunate indeed that it was Howard who developed the Atlantic Giants we use in our mighty pursuits. If we have received national and international acclaim for our mastery as pumpkin growers and gardeners, then we are constrained to confess the name of Howard Dill to one and all. Special people like Howard Dill represent Everyman. Howard has always been there


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
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
